


Woodville Plantation

Preservation in Progress!

Thanks to the generous contributions from Richard M. Scaife, the estate of Dr. Pearl McNall, The Schoonmaker Foundation, and The National Society of the Colonial Dames in Pennsylvania we are implementing an ambitious program of exterior restoration at Woodville. Just completed is the replacement of the exterior siding on the southern facade, which had deteriorated badly because it is the weather side of the house. Underway is the process of restoring and conserving the window sashes and original glass panes throughout the house, a project that will be done in several phases over time as funding permits. The biggest project in the near future is the complete restoration of the porches. Rebuilt most recently in 1997, time has again taken its toll on the porch decks and supporting structure, making this project a priority.

The Still House, which serves as office space, storage space, kitchen, and meeting venue (and thus has become a vital part of the property) was completely repainted. Also, a new cement pad was installed in our driveway to make access safer for all of our guests.

Finally, be aware that to accommodate all of these restoration activities we will be closing the site for house tours from December 9, 2013 until our re-opening on February 16, 2014 when we will feature a Military Miniatures Exhibition.
